

# Get Ready For Camp 2011!

Here's the stuff you need to know to get ready for camp next week! **PLEASE READ CAREFULLY** before Sunday so that if you have questions, you can get those answered at the camper meeting on Sunday night.

## ***Itinerary***

Monday morning, June 27<sup>th</sup>:

Meet at TLC at 8am.

**BRING MONEY FOR FAST FOOD FOR LUNCH ON THE WAY.**

Thursday evening, June 30<sup>th</sup>:

You will need **MONEY FOR LUNCH** on the way home.

Campers will arrive back at TLC at or near 6pm, depending on traffic. We will keep campers updated so that they can call home with up-to-date arrival info.

## ***LUGGAGE:***

Each camper is allowed 2 bags/suitcases, **plus** pillow and bedding. It's a good idea to label ALL bags well, even if you've put your bedding in a trash bag.

## ***CELL PHONES and ELECTRONICS:***

Though cell phones are allowed at camp, we ask that they only be used for communicating with parents. This week at camp is for focusing on God, so let's get all He has for us! As for electronics, leave them at home. No electronics will be allowed on the bus. Spend time getting to know people!

## ***PRESCRIPTIONS:***

Please note that if a camper has prescription medication, all medication must be taken to nurse's station upon arrival. The nurse dispenses all meds. Please only bring enough medicine for the camp week. **TLC will not be responsible for medication left at camp.** All medication should be well labeled.

## General Info

### Spending Money

You *don't have to* bring extra money except for lunch on the way to camp and back. However, you might like to have some extra money for riding Go-Carts (\$3), Horses (\$6), buying t-shirts or extra snacks at the Grill. You've already paid for camp meals, but snacks are offered at extra cost during other parts of the day. T-shirts are typically priced from \$10-\$20 depending on the style. Offering money is also good to have. You may find that you'd like to give in the offering so that others can experience camp like you have.

### Dress Code

Modest dress is required. No spaghetti straps. Undergarments should not be showing (guys or girls!). One-piece bathing suits for girls are also required. Casual dress is recommended otherwise. Dress for services is nice-casual.

### Emergency Conditions

During regular hours, the number to call is 979-732-9200. After hours, recorders are checked periodically.

### Nursing, First Aid

Youth group leaders will have First-Aid kits if needed. For further assistance, a leader will accompany campers to the Healing Center (Nurse Station).

### Lost or Stolen Items

Though we are attending church camp, please keep in mind that not everyone attending is a Christian! (We pray they get saved at camp, though!) That being said, please keep valuable items at home. Also, keep your luggage put away at camp! What's not seen is less likely to be taken. If you have a way to lock your bags, that's another good way to deter theft. Keep in mind that neither TLC nor Discovery Camp are responsible for lost or stolen items.

### Discipline

We believe TLC has some of the best students at camp! And, we expect our campers to act their best! Minor issues will be handled by TLC group leaders. Please note, however, that major rule violations may result in campers being sent home. Please make sure you read and understand the camper guidelines enclosed.

## **Guidelines for Campers**

1. Each camper will refrain from any use of profanity.
2. Firearms, knives or weapons of any nature are prohibited.
3. Alcohol, drugs or any form of tobacco is prohibited.
4. Male and female campers should dress in a modest manner which exhibits Godly character.
5. Shaving cream or water balloon fights are prohibited on camp premises.
6. Campers should refrain from personal displays of affection with members of the opposite sex.
7. Food or drink is prohibited inside the chapel or any dorm facilities.
8. All campers will be expected to be inside their

assigned dorms no later than the announced curfew.

9. Physical or verbal altercations will not be tolerated among campers or staff personnel.

10. All campers are asked to stay within the lighted areas of the camp during nighttime hours.

11. Persons or groups responsible for destruction of camp property will be accountable for replacement or repair cost of such property.

12. The use or possession of fireworks is prohibited by campers.

13. All campers must attend Chapel Services. Illness would be the only exemption upon approval of the group leader.
